AGENDA FOR ACTION



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Purpose

The Rainbow Valley Area Plan promotes efficient and pleasant rural communities by encouraging growth in areas suitable for development, and by creating an efficient transportation system, a healthy environment, and diverse economy. However, ensuring plan success requires an effective implementation program.

The Rainbow Valley action plan identifies both long and short-term measures that can help implement the plan's goals, objectives, and policies. While some of the activities require actions for a specific period of time, most will require ongoing efforts. In addition, successful plan implementation will require close cooperation, coordination, and communication between public and private agencies, as well as citizens and other concerned interests. Each of these groups will play an important role in plan success, and Maricopa County encourages their continuing participation. **Table 24** details the Rainbow Valley Action Plan, and is organized as follows:
